

In late 1945 SF-1413 advised that Bartley Cavanaugh Crum (subject of 100-334436) contacted David Jenkins, CP Director of the California Labor School, and told Jenkins he had a letter from Morris Ernst, which letter had a newspaper clipping enclosed castigating Communism. Crum stated Ernst needed a little "treatment" and he planned to write Ernst to tell him some of his best friends were Communists and Jews.

The Fourth Report of Un-American Activities in California in 1948 on Communist Front Organizations, under the heading "American Civil Liberties Union" information was brought out in full regarding Morris L. Ernst's connection with the ACLU. Ernst was on the Board of Directors in 1946.

It was also brought out that Ernst was on the Board of Directors of the American Fund for Public Service. Also, that he was among the Communists and Communist fellow-travellers who had written textbooks for use in public schools.

Under the heading of "Garland Fund", Ernst was listed as having served as a director or officer of the Fund or its subsidiaries.
