

Ernst on first impulse wanted to discharge Zipper but thought possibly he could cooperate with the Bureau by keeping her and obtaining information from her. He was advised by interviewing Agents they could not dictate any policy that might result in embarrassment to him and Ernst stated he would take steps to divert confidential matter from Zipper.

Zipper's letter to Nalibou was forwarded to the Bureau for examination along with handwriting specimens of Zipper's.
