

This reference is a memo from Mr. Tamm to the Director dated 1-14-47 advising of the Helen Zipper (subject of 100-348261) matter involving the law office of Morris Ernst, NYC, and employment of Zipper as receptionist. NYC Field Office agents contacted Ernst to advise him the Bureau records contained no information about Zipper but that was not conclusive, etc.

Ernst advised the Agents that he and his law partners had decided to discharge the girl and advise her she was being discharged because of her misconduct in copying official correspondence and sending it to persons who had no right thereto.

On 2-3-47 Morris L. Ernst was interviewed in NYC and apprised of Yetta Haber's reported CP affiliations and impressed with the fact the information should be retained in strictest confidence, to which he agreed.

At the same time Ernst advised he had summoned Helen Zipper (subject of 100-348261) for the purpose of discussing with her the action she desired taken in connection with filing a "Termination of Employment Form" with the Social Security Board. Ernst explained to Zipper that he did not wish to perjure himself with the Social Security Board and would inform the Board she was discharged for disloyalty, which he did.

Ernst advised of a matter concerning his being consulted as an attorney by the National Council of Jewish Women, described as composed of middle-class Jewish women with offices in NYC. Ernst stated he would take up the matter of three members of the group having called on him regarding a complaint, with the Director so the Agents took no action in the matter.
