On 7-8-54 Irwin D. Lester was interviewed at the NYC Field Office at which time he was shown a photograph of Samuel Perlman which he identified. Lester stated Perlman was associated with him, Lester, at Lester's law office, NYC. He related, however, that Perlman had, recently, become associated in a company processing aluminum and believed Perlman was an officer in the aluminum company and spent little time at the law office. Lester stated Morris Ernst had handled and was handling all legal matters in connection with the corporation and also all legal matters for Perlman.
