On 2-15-52 Morris Ernst advised Mr. Nichols that Urcel Daniels (subject of 100-388992), 2222 I Street NW, Washington, D.C., had at one time been in the CP and had helped Ernst during the fight to oust Communists from the American Newspaper Guild. She was one of the best anti-Communists he had ever seen. (u)

Ernst thought the Bureau should interview Daniels and it would be satisfactory to use his name. Ernst stated Tavenner of the HCUA was after Daniels and he, of course, would like for the Bureau to have Tavenner "lay off of her." (u)

On 1-15-52 George Roberts of Winthrop, Stimson, Putnam and Roberts, NYC, wrote to the FBI enclosing copies of a leaflet "Is the Atom Bomb a Hoax and a Fraud? Is Atomic Energy a Delusion and a Snare?" put out by the "Save America Committee" (subject of 105-14064). Roberts asked if the organization was a crank or a subversive. He thought the idea of Morris Ernst, that all anonymous propaganda should be prohibited and everyone using interstate means of communication be required to file with proper authorities, was sound. (u)
