On 8-27-42 Walter Steele of the "National Republic" magazine furnished Photostats of material from his files. Among this material was a flier put out by the Keep America Out of War National Committee advertising a National Anti-War Congress to be held 5/28-30/38 at the Rialto Theater, Washington, D.C. The flier listed Morris Ernst, Civil Liberties attorney, as a member of the organization.

In an interview with Kurt G. Sell (subject of 65-1458), Washington representative of the Reichs-Rundfunk-Gesellschaft Newspaper, Germany, on 11-16-38, Kurt stated that at one time he telephoned news reviews to Germany which were re-broadcast by shortwave and received in the U.S. Due to the furor caused by these programs and at the request of Frank S. Mason, in charge of the Shortwave Division of R.C.A., and further because of the activities of Morris L. Ernst, the Dies Committee and the proposed activities of the Federal Communications Commission, he discontinued the broadcasts.
