In a letter published in the "Nation" on 2-3-32, Morris Ernst was listed as a member of the National Council of the League for Industrial Democracy (LID) (subject of 61-524) for 1932.

The "Washington^(D.C.) Herald" of 1-9-33 stated that the officers of the LID were, for the most part, those who guide the "red" defending ACLU, Ernst being one of them.

The personnel file of Mathew Silverman (subject of 100-284103) at HOLC, Washington, D.C., revealed that on 12-7-33 David K. Niles, Director, Ford Hall Forum, Boston, wrote a letter to Hon. John H. Fahey, Chairman of the Home Loan Bank Board. In the letter he stated that Silverman had a job in 1932 as clerk in Judge Shalleck's office in NYC. The Shalleck office was a "Tammany law office" and Silverman had refused to take a job there but Morris Ernst and Niles talked the matter over with Silverman and convinced him that the experience he would get in that office would be invaluable.
