The Postmaster, Palmer, Alaska, (protect identity) furnished a letter addressed to Herbert C. Hanson (subject of 61-10572) Palmer, bearing return address of ACLU, NYC. The envelope contained a Bulletin #994, Press Service of ACLU, dated 10-13-41. The first page of the press release carried the names of the officers of the organization and Morris L. Ernst was listed as counsel.
