This reference is a memo for the Director dated 3-5-42 concerning the Executive Conference considering revision of the faculty list contained in the booklet "Personnel Selection and Training in the FBI." The Conference, among other things, recommended that Morris Leopold Ernst and others be added to the faculty list and biographical sketches on them were included with the reference.

On 3-12-42 Morris L. Ernst advised the NYC Field Office that Julius Stulman had a program in mind which called for the recruiting of experienced and qualified newspaper men throughout the US as a unit of the FBI. Mr. Stulman was interviewed in regard to his plan at which time the jurisdiction of the FBI together with an outline of the existing policies of the FBI were mentioned to Stulman as well as our program in connection with the Law Enforcement Officers Mobilization Plan for national defense. Stulman stated he was then of the opinion the FBI had the internal security situation well covered.
