

The following references contain information pertaining to Morris Ernst in connection with the allegation that Senator David I. Walsh of Massachusetts had frequented a house of degradation in Brooklyn in May, 1942, which house was reportedly frequented by Nazi spies. Ernst was accused of participating in an attempt to smear Walsh. Ernst was also counsel for the "NY Post" which carried the story. Walsh was exonerated by the FBI.
